Waste Management Guidelines for Garbage and Recyclable Collection for Village of East Aurora

TIME – All garbage and recyclables shall be placed at the curb for collection by 6:00 AM on your scheduled day, but not sooner than 18 hours prior to collection date. All streets are covered once only. Receptacles shall be removed from the curb within 12 hours after being emptied.

SIZE AND WEIGHT -All garbage should be placed in bags or cans not to exceed 32-gallon capacity and/or weigh more than 60 pounds. Any material not in cans or bags should be securely tied in bundles no more than four (4) feet in length.

ITEM LIMIT -On a weekly basis, a limit of four (4) items of acceptable refuse and waste materials will be collected per family unit. This is not based on an average number of items, it is (4) items per unit, per week.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Tires, Pesticides, Solvents, Motor Oil, Flammable Materials, Asbestos, Automotive Batteries, Paint (unless cans are emptied), Computers/Computer Monitors, Cell Phones, Pool Chemicals, Propane Tanks. For Information on the proper disposal of these Household Hazardous Wastes, contact Erie County at 858-6800 (www.erie.gov).

BULKY WASTE COLLECTION - Once a week, each family unit will be entitled to discard one (1) bulky item (i.e.. Mattress, box spring, furniture or appliance).

Please note that large metal items will be picked up the following day.

In accordance with the disposal ban requirements of Section 27-2611 of the Electronic Equipment Recycling and Reuse Act, on **January 1st, 2015**, it will become unlawful for residential households in New York State to place electronic equipment at the curb for disposal.

Due to this change in law, Waste Management will no longer be collecting electronic waste at the curb after 12/31/14 – even if segregated from the rest of the household trash.

RECYCLING - Place your recyclables out weekly on the same day as your garbage collection. Place all acceptable material into the recycling bins provided and follow the recycling guide in packet.

NEED RECYCLING BINS ?? Contact the Village Hall for purchase at 716.652.6000. Cost is \$6/per bin

EXTRA ITEMS -There is a limit of 4 items per household. For extra items, contact Village of East Aurora Clerk's Office at 571 Main St (corner of Paine). Hours are 8 am – 4 pm Monday thru Friday. Extra stickers are available for \$1.00 each. The stickers may be placed on any extra 32 gallon can or bag, and will be picked up with your weekly garbage.

CONSTRUCTION - If you are doing home remodeling, Waste Management has 10-30 cubic yard containers that can be dropped off at your home. Please contact Waste Management *for* further details @ 496-5000 or 1-800-422-4040. Construction debris will not be picked up with your regular trash.

YARD WASTE - Plant clippings, branches and twigs will be picked up by Waste Management as part of the 4 item limit as long as they are placed properly in a suitable container, or tied and bundled less than 4' in length and weighing less than 70 lbs. Brush and Tree Limbs will be picked up by the Village. The Village will also provide curbside Leaf Vacuuming (in the fall only).

BRUSH & TREE LIMB COLLECTION
FALL LEAF COLLECTION
GRASS CLIPPINGS

BRUSH (less than one half inch in diameter) **MUST BE** tied in bundles not to exceed six inches in diameter and six feet in length. **(LIMIT 4 BUNDLES PER WEEK)**.

TREE LIMBS (one inch to six inches in diameter) **KEEP LIMBS AS LONG AS POSSIBLE FOR CHIPPING**. Limbs shorter than **FOUR FEET MUST BE** placed in neat piles. **(LIMIT SIZE OF PILE TO 4 FEET WIDE, BY 10 FEET LONG, AND 4 FEET HIGH PER WEEK)**.

ALL BRUSH AND TREE LIMBS MUST BE SET OUT WITHIN THREE FEET OF THE CURB OR EDGE OF THE ROAD, ACCORDING TO THESE GUIDELINES, OR IT WILL NOT BE COLLECTED. ONLY BRUSH GENERATED BY VILLAGE RESIDENTS WILL BE COLLECTED. CONTRACTORS MUST REMOVE THEIR OWN BRUSH. (Collections will be every working Monday from April 4, 2016 until Monday October 3, 2016).

FALL LEAF COLLECTION TO AVOID FLOODING AND SNOW REMOVAL PROBLEMS, RAKE LEAVES TO THE CURB ONLY--LEAVES MUST NOT BE RAKED INTO THE STREET. (BAGGED LEAVES WILL NOT BE COLLECTED).

LEAVES MUST BE PILED TO WITHIN 3 FEET OF THE CURB OR EDGE OF ROAD, OTHERWISE THEY WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.

Leaves will be vacuumed beginning Tuesday, October 11, 2016 until Tuesday, November 22, 2016, (weather permitting). Questions ?? call The Dept. of Public Works at 652-6057

A **MINIMAL** amount of **CONTAINERIZED GRASS OR LAWN CLIPPINGS** will be collected by **WASTE MANAGEMENT** (1-800-422-4040) on your regular garbage collection day. Containers of **YARD WASTE** will be considered part of your four can weekly limit.

GRASS CLIPPINGS will also be accepted on a drop-off basis at an attended, fenced in area near the D.P.W. garage on the Pine Street Extension, 9am – 2pm on Saturdays from April 2, 2016 until October 15, 2016.

Do Include: waste resulting from the handling, storage, sale, preparation, cooking or serving of foods, light bulbs, empty paint cans (latex only), regular household waste, any non-recyclable item, yard waste, Christmas trees.

Do Not Include: tires, pesticides, oils/oil barrels, paste board barrels, warm/hot ashes, 55-gallon drums, solvents, flammable materials left by contractor, asbestos board, paint, pool chemicals, large propane tanks, automobile batteries or parts, railroad ties, suspicious waste, or any other waste required by law to be disposed of at a hazardous waste facility.

GUIDELINES FOR PROPER DISPOSAL OF RESIDENTIAL HOME HEALTH CARE WASTE

Customers generating syringes, hypodermic needles or sharps are required to notify WM.

*Place all needles, syringes or other sharp objects in a hard plastic container with a screw-in cap (such as a detergent bottle). The plastic container should not be clear or see through. Once full, screw the cap on and secure the cap to the container with tape. Place the container in the middle of your garbage and in a garbage can or tote-**NEVER IN A RECYCLING BIN.***

Do not place needles, syringes or other sharp objects in a clear plastic, glass, or aluminum container. Do not use any container for home health care waste that will be recycled or returned to the store. WM also recommends that soiled bandages, disposable sheets, and medical gloves be placed in securely fastened plastic bags before they are placed in a garbage can with your other trash.

If you administer home health care, WM will not collect your garbage if all of your refuse is not in a hard plastic or metal garbage can. Please be sure that your home health care waste is not separated from or outside your normal refuse.
